

Consultant To Aid Medical School Study

Kentucky Educator
Named To Survey
Needs, Facilities

Dr. William R. Willard, vice president of the University of Kentucky and dean of its new medical school, today was appointed a consultant to the committee which is studying the feasibility of establishing a medical school in Toledo.

Dr. Frank Rawling, committee chairman, said Dr. Willard was responsible for establishing the medical school in Lexington, Ky., which opened last fall.

Conference Planned

Dr. Rawling said Willard Smith, director of administration at the University of Toledo, who also is aiding the committee, was to go to Lexington today to confer with Dr. Willard.

On July 24 Dr. Willard will come to Toledo and will spend at least a week in the city studying community medical needs and facilities. Later, he will make a report to the committee, which, in turn, expects to report its findings to Mayor Damas this fall.

\$6,500 Appropriated

Council has appropriated \$6,500 for the study, which was outlined at a meeting in Toledo last fall which Dr. Willard attended.

Dr. Willard formerly was a professor of public health at Yale University and dean of the college of medicine at New York University in Syracuse. He left Syracuse in 1956 to go to Lexington, where he was responsible for the planning and the recruitment of faculty for the Kentucky medical school.
