Five scientists will discuss heat energy sources of the future at the annual symposium of the Northwestern Ohio Section of the American Ceramic Society on Monday (Jan. 18). The meeting, at 2 p.m. in the Crystal Room of the Commodore Perry Hotel, is part of an all-day session to be attended by about 300.

Panelists are Dr. Peter E. Glaser of Arthur D. Little, Inc., Cambridge, Mass.; Charles H. Marks, manager of development engineering for the Bituminous Coal Institute, Washington, D.C.; Frederic O. The symposium follows a luncheon at which Dr. William S. Carlson, president of the University of Toledo will be the principal speaker.
