1. Treasurer's Report

2. Secretary's Comments/Correspondence

3. Committee Reports

Operating Committees:

Ways and Means: Pat Czerminski reported that we made \$402.00 on the Entertainment Books.

Style Show: The style show is scheduled for Saturday, April 24 at Brandywine Country Club. The Tickets will be \$15.00. We will again have a Cruise Raffle. Will get tickets out for the raffle by February 25th. We'll have a board up for Gift Certificates -- a minimum of \$15 for the prizes. We will put an insert in the program listing the prizes. Former Deaf Women Honoree's will participate as models. There was some discussion regarding whether we needed actual tickets. It was decided that we would use tickets. It was also recommended that we redesign the raffle tickets so that there would not be so much waste.

Promotion: Promotion committee requested that they would like information for style show so that they can promote it. They did not get information regarding the Deaf Woman of the Year. If our club nomination wins, we will promote her at that point.

Membership: Alice Skeens not present. Diane asked that we get names to Alice of prospective members. The Birthday meeting in February is a good meeting for new members.

Newsletter: We are currently sending out about 64 newsletters a month. We'd like to increase that number to 100. If the membership has some recommendations, please get the names to Carol Russell. Will check the lists for representatives from the Ability Center, B.G. Handicapped Services, Toledo Speech and Hearing, Sertoma. Also Carolyn Hetrick, and Mrs. Bruford would like to be on the mailing list.

Service Committees:

Community and World Service: JoAnn Scott reported on some projects that the committee would like to recommend for consideration by the membership:

1. Bittersweet Farms: they need items such as dishwasher, items for the greenhouse, volunteers for special weekends. This facility serves autistic adults.

2. Aurora House: a house for substance abuse mothers. They need educational toys, toilet articles, gifts for babies.

3. Bethany House: a place for abused mothers. also need toilet articles.

4. Toledo Mental Health: the club would adopt a unit -- plan social activities and food for an evening.

There was some discussion regarding the different projects. There will be a sign-up sheet at the January 18 meeting as well as a list of personal items that people can donate to some of the above projects.

Hearing Speech and Scholarship: Deaf Women of the Year candidate papers have been sent to District. There will be an announcement at the end of February.

4. Attendance

Lois Miller has submitted her resignation. Wink Fox made the motion that we accept with regret. Catherine Ruby seconded the motion. The motion was carried.

Chris Palmerton will be sent a letter indicating that she needs to participate and attend, or we will no longer accept her membership. The motion was made that we send the letter by Doris Ice, Carol Russell seconded. Motion carried.

5. Sixth District

The Governor's visit will be March 1, 1993. There will be a board meeting 1/2 hour before.

Annual reports are due February 1, 1993 so that Diane can send them to the governor before they arrive.

Diane brought to our attention the two District Projects that we help fund: (1) Assistance & loan fund, and the Columbus Colony, a retirement community serving hearing impaired and handicapped.

There will be no central area meeting this year because of the expenses involved. Pat Sandy has been nominated for the Central Area Director by the Sixth District. Wilma Steele from Iowa is also running.

7. International
